HAMBLEDEN NATIONAL SCHOOL.

On Friday, November 6th, the Rev. H. W. Bellairs, one of her Majesty's Inspectors of Schools, paid his annual visit of inspection. When he came last year he found many faults, and suggested many improvements. We are happy to say that on his recent visit, he expressed himself as much pleased with the decided improvement that had taken place in the school generally. He made an entry on the Master's certificate to this effect. He still shewed the managers and teachers that there is plenty to be done, and that they cannot relax their exertions in any particular. But it is very satisfactory to all parties to be assured that amendment has been made. He asked for a half-holiday for the children, which was granted, and was spent in drinking tea and eating buns, by those children who had kept their required number of attendances, namely, 200 in the course of the year. Some children were excluded, because through irregularity they had not attended a sufficient number of days. The number required is so small, 200 attendances or 100 days, that there is no excuse for any child who is not sick, and who does not go to work a part of the year, falling short of it.
