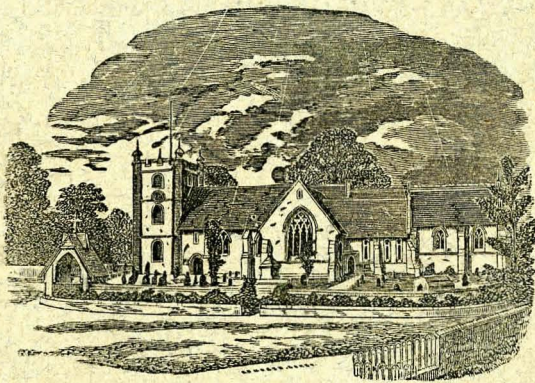

ON Thursday, the 25th of May, the Rev. C. M. Wetherall was formally inducted to the Rectory of Hambleden, by the Ven. the Archdeacon of Bucks. After the usual Evensong up to the Third Collect, the Archdeacon gave a short Address, explaining the object of the service, and desiring the prayers of the congregation for their new Rector, after which the Ceremony of Induction was proceeded with, and the service concluded with the blessing pronounced by the Rector.

On Sunday, the 28th, the Rector read himself in at the Morning Service.

A very interesting letter has been received by the Vicar from Mrs. Joseph Rose, in Queensland. The whole of it is well worth reading, and any of her friends (she wishes to be kindly remembered to all) can see it for the asking. An extract or so, descriptive of her experience by sea and land, may entertain some who have never seen the sea, or been abroad. Describing a storm at sea, she writes, "It lasted thirty-six hours, and very much alarmed us; it was a fearful sight on deck. Our ship lay in a deep hollow, and the large waves rose up like hills all round, and looked as though every moment they must break over." Then of her new home she says, "There are a great many snakes here, some of them eight and ten feet long. It is nothing unusual to find one in your house—we have had several. I have killed two myself in our house."
